ELIGIBILITY

• Seriously ill/injured (SI) or very seriously ill/injured (VSI) identified on an AF Casualty Report

- Highly complex medical conditions
- Airmen diagnosed with PTS or TBI who have been referred or are likely to be referred through the Medical Evaluation Board process
- Purple Heart recipients

• Air Reserve Component members who are retained for more than 6 months on Title 10 medical orders, or Airmen who are returned to Title 10 orders for a deployment related (serious/ severe) condition(s).

RCC

The primary mission of the Recovery Care Coordinator (RCC) is to facilitate, monitor, and ensure access to care and resources for seriously or very seriously wounded, ill and injured (WII) Airmen and their families. RCCs allow for a smooth transition from immediate hospital recovery to long-term adaptability and care.

LOCATION

RCCs are considered the program's "boots on the ground" and advocate for the Airman, and caregiver. Every installation has an assigned RCC; however, the RCC may not be located on that installation. Each RCC is responsible for a region and are strategically stationed where there is historically a high volume of WII Airmen being treated.

RCCs educate and guide Airmen through the first four phases of the Continuum of Care. and always serves as the local area referral expert for Airmen in need.

<u>GOALS</u>

- Prevent unnecessary delays
 - •Reduce anxiety
- Obtain accurate and responsive information and services

<u>CRP</u>

The Comprehensive Recovery Plan (CRP) identifies the Airman & family's goals and the resources they need to achieve them, such as assistive technology, education, employment and housing. AFW2 care managers (RCCs/NMCMs) use the plan to guide Airmen and their families, through the continuum of care, on the road to recovery.

<u>ROLE</u>

Your Non-Medical Care Managers (NMCM) are centrally located at HQ AFPC, JBSA Randolph, TX. They are the subject matter experts that serve enrolled Airmen and provide support to the RCCs in the field.

<u>CCM</u>

Clinical Case Managers (CCMs), normally nurses or social workers, ensure the Airmen and their family understand care options and have timely and quality access to recommended treatment, to include both lengthy inpatient or outpatient health services. They also work with RCCs to help identify Airmen who can best be assisted by AFW2.

TRANSITIONING OUT OF SERVICE

If a determination is made that the Airman will transition out of the Air Force and into the civilian sector, the NMCM will normally take the lead coordinator role and assist the Airman and family throughout the transition period. This includes but is not limited to:

- \Rightarrow Benefits
- \Rightarrow Entitlements
- \Rightarrow Housing
- \Rightarrow Transportation counseling
- ⇒ Program & Service Referrals

WARM HAND-OFF

NMCMs are responsible for providing non-medical care when Airmen are placed on the Temporary Disabilities Retired Listing (TDRL) as well as helping transition (ensuring a warm hand-off) to the Veteran Affairs (VA) support system.
