#### Air Force Reserve Legislative Priorities



Maintain and Sustain Strategic Depth – A Lethal, Ready and Dynamic Air Force Reserve requires AFR end-strength authorizations and sufficient career field manning, predictable budgets, and adequate funding, to enable full spectrum readiness, and surge capability and capacity 2. Reserve Personnel Appropriation (RPA) and Operation & Maintenance (O&M) Funding – Critical MEANS to maintaining and sustaining strategic depth enabling the AFR to achieve its primary mission objective– provide combat ready forces 3.
