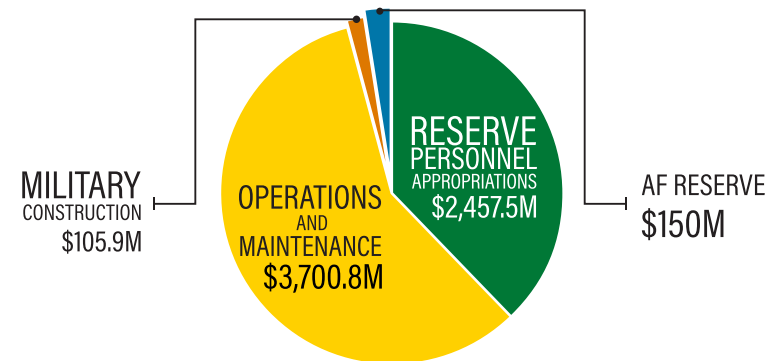

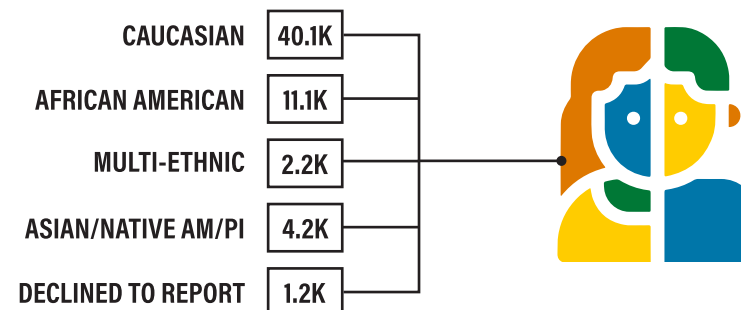

## AIR FORCE RESERVE CONGRESSIONAL PRIORITIES

### CONCURRENT AND PROPORTIONAL FIELDING

The National Commission on the Structure of the Air Force states "...in advance of full integration, new equipment will arrive at Air Reserve Component units simultaneously with its arrival at Active Component units in the proportional share of each component." The Air Force Reserve must provide strategic depth and surge capacity while remaining lethal and interoperable. This requires recapitalization and fielding of weapon systems concurrently and proportionally with the active and Guard components.

### TRICARE RESERVE SELECT

Implementing Tricare Reserve Select soonest is crucial in helping remedy current recruiting, retention, and readiness issues. This impacts and affects the quality of life of more than 7,000 authorized Air Reserve Technicians by limiting their access to an affordable healthcare option specifically designed for their unique needs. This legislation is critical to retain manpower and talent in the Reserve component.

### DUTY STATUS REFORM

This legislation consolidates more than 30 duty statuses into just 4 categories, better aligns pay and benefits, and mitigates disparities of benefits and disruptions in pay. This would also streamline deployments and enhance overall readiness. We urge Congress to continue to work with the DoD and OMB to move this legislation forward.

### NATIONAL GUARD AND RESERVE EQUIPMENT APPROPRIATION (NGREA)

NGREA allows for Reserve component equipment procurement and modernization resourcing to sustain a strong, relevant and lethal operational and strategic force.
