# AIR FORCE RESERVE STRENGTHS

## **COST EFFECTIVE**

75% part-time force; operate 28 days a month with 25% of the force; data shows life cycle costs for part-time are less than 33 cents on the dollar

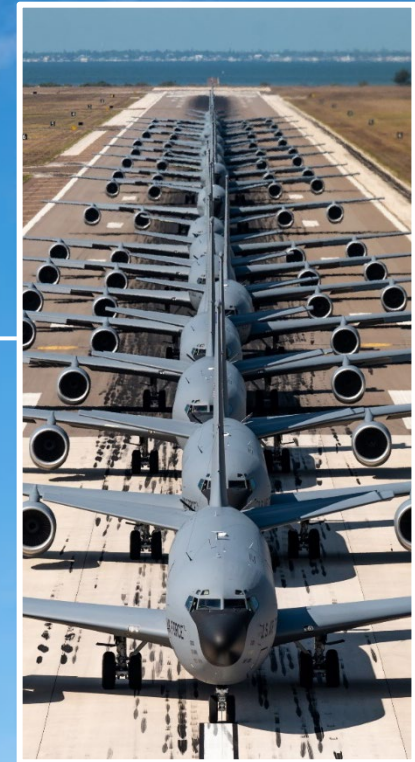
